Voluntary dues are just \$30 a year. For those who have contributed more that is very much appreciated. In the spring we will be asking for dues and we appreciate your contribution.

Future business being discussed with further information forthcoming:

- Establishing a tool loaner club- Members willing to loan out tools to their neighbors. Neighbors helping neighbors rather than a one-time buying of a tool you may use once in ten years.
- Securing a discount membership with the Naylor Observatory in Lewisberry for anyone interested in star gazing. Use of their on-site large telescopes to scope the night skies and loaner telescopes that you can sign out for use at home.
- Developing ideas on fund raising efforts. The collection of dues maintain the park but beyond that raising extra funds will expand activities for our development
- The purchase of an attractive sign, "Welcome to Berkshire Hills," with the location to be determined.
- We are looking the strike a deal with a local nursery for a discount on our landscaping needs.

Our association has been somewhat reborn and the board is anxious to serve and provide for the neighborhood. We are always open to any suggestions on items discussed herein or any other ideas you may have to improve our neighborhood.
